From the Chairman

July and August have been some of the busiest months ever for the Riesling Trail, going by our Traker readings and comments from local businesses, such as bike hire. There are many people from Adelaide making trips to the Clare Valley and fitting in cycling along the Trail as part of their visit. For July the numbers were over 10,000 – normally the sort of number we see in April and is around double what we normally have in midwinter. So far this year we are nearly 20% above normal, compared with our usual increase year on year of 4%.

The weather generally has been great for being outdoors and the only thing causing concern at this time of year is the odd swooping magpie. I have seen many curious additions to helmets to try to deter them, from the usual cable ties, to camouflaging with branches to a photo of John Travolta.

Plans are well advanced for widening Quarry Road bridge, from its current 1.5m to be 3m wide. This will make it a lot safer and allow for two-way traffic. Plans have been approved and construction of the new frame has started. We are grateful to Greg Pulford Architects, Mace Engineering and Clare Metal Fabrications for their support with this project. We are also very grateful to the SA Government, Office for Recreation, Sport & Racing, and to the Grosset Gaia Fund for their financial support. Rest assured we will be keeping the same archway profile. In fact, these sides will be cut off and fitted to the

new bridge. The bridge will be missing from the trail for possibly a couple of weeks to prepare for the new bridge. This will include fitting the sides, sand blasting, repainting and adding new decking, similar to that used for the bridge just north of Auburn. We will also be installing new guard rails. This new bridge is expected to be in place later this year, if all goes well. We will let trail users and related businesses know well in advance of when this closure will be.

We have also installed a few more solar lights along the trail towards Wendouree Road. These add to those we have already installed from the southern car park on Station Road up to Warenda Road. They are not designed to light up the trail, but rather as a guide for trail users in the evening.

Those travelling along the new section of the trail at Auburn will have noticed a lot of tree seedlings planted nearby to enhance this section of the trail. A special thank you to Leonie Moore and her team with the Upper Wakefield Landcare group and to the Auburn Primary School children who helped with some of this planting.
